PROSPECTUS-STDS

This prospectus will come into force with effect from 31st March, 1988, with retrospective effect, irrespective of a student's date of admission.

The interpretation of any rule contained herein, as well as any amendment rests solely and entirely with the governing body of the school. Their decision will be final and binding on Parents/Guardians and no case shall lie in any court of law, in respect to their decision.

St. Teresa's School was founded on 11th July, 1968. It was started by joint Anglo Indian founders Hubert and Inez Fanthome on the request of the locality people to cater primarily for Anglo Indian Children. The founders seeing the need for a good school in the locality, felt obliged to make arrangements and consequently St. Teresa's Day School was founded.

St. Teresa's Day School was registered as a minority School under Article 30(1) of the Indian Constitution with the Registrar of Society on 28.2.87. The Uttar Pradesh Government recognized the school giving it a N.O.C. to affiliate itself to Council for the I.C.S.E./I.S.C. granted affiliation on 12th January, 1988. St. Teresa's Day School is an Unaided institution. We were upgraded to a junior college in the year 2001, thus the name St. Teresa's Day School & College.

St. Teresa's Day School & College is a modern and selected day school for Anglo Indian Children, however admission is not denied to those of other communities. At present it is imparting a sound physical and mental education to about 1500 children of the city of Lucknow.

A Child should be three years old for admission into class Nursery. The age is decided from 1st January to 1st June of the current year. Thus a child should be six years

old in Class One, and sixteen years old when he/she completes Class Ten and eighteen years old when he/she completes Class XII.

In Class Eleven, provisional admission is given to students, from any ICSE School in the country. This admission is based on their Progress Report of Classes Nine and Ten of their previous institution. The stream to be allotted is done by the College, based on the level of achievement in the required subjects. The admission become permanent only when the student submits a photo-copy of the ICSE pass certificate. Admission is also granted to students of other boards. However, the admission is only considered Permanent, when the Council for the Indian School Certificate Examination, New Delhi, issues an Eligibility Certificate. This Certificate is issued to (i) the Students passes the board Examination in ONE sitting, and (ii) the student passes in Hindi.

In Class Eleven the Courses offered are-Science and Commerce.

ADMISSION RULES

1. Prospectus and Registration Forms for admission from Nursery to Class IX, and Class XI, are available from the College Office from the 1st week of December of the current year on payment of Rs. 300 (Nursery), Rs. 500 (KG to XII). Admission in Classes Ten and Twelve can also be done, subject to approval of the Council. In this case, the student must be studying in a Recognised ICSE/ISC institution, and approval must be sought from the Council, before 31st July of the current year.
2. These forms duly filled, along with, Date of Birth Certificate, Photocopy of last Report Card (when required), must be returned to the College Office, within the stipulated period.
3. Admission will depend entirely on the Principal, who may accept or reject any admission form without assigning any reason.
4. Candidates selected for admission will deposit the admission fees, and Transfer Certificates in Original (where ever applicable by the stipulated date or will stand rejected. In case of admission into Class Eleven, two copies of the pass marksheet will also be required to be send to the Council to seek Eligibility.
5. All admissions should be made by Parents/Guardians who will be responsible for timely payment of fees.
6. Admission Fees and monthly Tuition Fees are mentioned on the Fee Chart. These are subject to change every year.

FEE RULES

1. Fees should be paid in **CASH** into the **SCHOOL OFFICE ONLY**, from **1st to 12th** of each month, failing which a fine of Rs. 50/- will be charged per month from 13th to 28th. No cheques will be accepted.

2. Fees are payable for **TWELVE** months of the year. **THERE WILL BE NO EXEMPTION OR DEDUCTION ON ACCOUNT OF BROKEN PERIODS, HOLIDAYS, OR ABSENCE DUE TO ANY CAUSE.**
3. School Office Hours 8:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. **(WEEK DAYS)**
8:00 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. **(SATURDAYS)**
4. If the student fails to pay the fees in the **THREE CONSECUTIVE MONTHS**, the child's name shall be struck off the College Rolls. Hence Parents/Guardians, who are facing a personal financial crisis, should place an application before the Principal, prior to this taking place.
5. **No student will be allowed to appear in the examination if the total dues are not cleared.**
6. Parents/ Guardians are responsible to deposit the exact amount of fees.
7. In Case of Re-admission, because of Rule 4, an application must be given to the Principal. Re-admission will be done, subject to the approval of the Managing Committee. **HOWEVER, FULL ADMISSION FEES WILL BE CHARGED.**
8. Parents/Guardians wishing to withdraw their children, must give an application, one month in advance, along with Rs. 200/-, else one month's tuition fee plus Rs.200/- will be charged in lieu of notice.
9. **FEES ONCE PAID, ARE NOT REFUNDABLE, DUE TO ANY CAUSE.**
10. a. Fees for **MAY / JUNE** should be paid by the **12th JULY**.
b. Fees for **NOV. / DEC.** should be paid by the **12th NOVEMBER**.
c. Fees for **FEB. / MAR.** should be paid by the **12th FEBRUARY**.
* If the thirteenth or 28th are holidays, fees will be accepted on the next working day without additional charge.

EXAMINATION

1. Promotion to the next class, depends on performance in assessments and examinations held during the course of the whole year and not on the performance in the final examination only.
2. K.G. to Class XII will be assessed in Aug./Nov./Feb. Nursery will be assessed in Nov./Feb. Class X and XII will have pre-board exams.
3. A student missing an examination, cannot appear for it a later date.
4. Answer scripts will be shown to students only on a fixed date.
5. **Answer scripts will not be shown to Parents (VI to XII).** However a parent may give an application for the rechecking of a script, to the Principal, on the payment of **Rs. 100/- per script.**
6. Report Cards will not be issued if fees are in arrears.
7. **A student who fails two years in the same class, will not be allowed to continue in the College.**
8. **Absence due to illness, must be supported by an application and a Medical Certificate, from a registered medical practitioner.**
9. **75% attendance is mandatory for promotion to the next class.** For class Ten 75% attendance in Class Nine and Ten, and for Class Twelve, 75% attendance in Classes Eleven and Twelve is demanded by the Council. The Council will be notified, regarding defaulters in this respect, who in turn, may not allow the student to sit for the Board Examination.
10. The decision made by the Principal, in consultation with the concerned teachers is final.

GENERAL RULES

1. Student's name may be struck off from the college rolls for the following reasons :
 - (a) Fees are not paid.
 - (b) Fails two years in the same class.
 - (c) Gross misconduct.
 - (d) Is in a habit of using unfair means in examinations.
 - (e) Parents/Guardians do not conform to college regulations.
 - (f) If the college feels that the child is not benefitting by continuing his/her education.
 - (g) Parent receive three important notices regarding the child, and pay no heed.
2. Parents/Guardians are not allowed to see students or interview teachers without prior permission of the Principal, during working hours.
3. Parents/Guardians may meet the teachers on every working day after College hours, except Saturdays and holidays.
4. Parents/Guardians are responsible to see that their children reach College on time and make arrangements for them to go home immediately after College Hours. The Management will not be held responsible for any student after working hours.
5. Parents should attend the College office when sent for by the Principal.
6. No parent should get their child tutored by a teacher of the College unless permission is obtained, in writing, from the Principal. Stern action will be taken against parents who waive this rule.
7. Once a student comes to college, he/she will NOT be allowed to leave the campus, during working hours, unless the FATHER/MOTHER comes to collect them, after seeking the permission of the Principal. No application for leave during working hours will be entertained.
8. Students, in uniform, are ambassadors of the College, hence they are expected to behave in a responsible manner, while on their way to, and back from College.
9. **Irregular attendance, habitual idleness, constant neglect of home work, disobedience and disrespect towards to College Staff, or bad moral influence, will merit dismissal.**
10. Any kind of damage to College property, must be made good.
11. Students are not granted leave, outside the vacation period, except in the case of illness, which must be supported by a Medical Certificate.
12. Students suffering from, or being in contact with an infectious disease, must produce a certificate, from a competent authority, that he/she may attend classes, without risk of conveying the infection.
13. Pupils may be required to take part in various extra-curricular and co-curricular activities. When required to do so, participation will be deemed compulsory by the College authorities.
14. Ordinarily, a College Diary is published under the authority of the Institution each year. Any changes in the rules, are notified in this Diary. Student, must possess a copy of this book. Parents should check the college diary daily. **A duplicate will be issued only on a payment of Rs. 200.**
15. Parents are expected to co-operate in the work of the school in particular enforcing regularity and discipline by evincing interest in their child's progress and by extending their fullest encouragement to participate in co-curricular and extra curricular activities. Parents should also check the College Diary regularly.
16. Bringing of cell phones to school strictly prohibited.
17. Students who bring money and wear jewellery to school do so at their own risk.
18. **No child under eighteen will be allowed to come to school on Motorcycle/ Scooter as prohibited by law. Helmets compulsory.**
19. Chewing of tobacco is strictly prohibited.
20. Students are not allowed to wear mehndi, or any form of makeup during school.

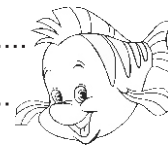
